- Module 3 – Friday, 11 November 2011

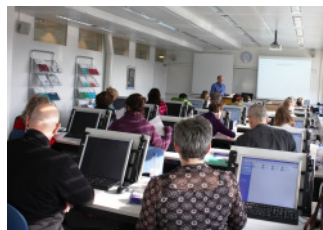
